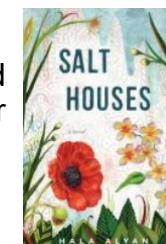
Against the Loveless World

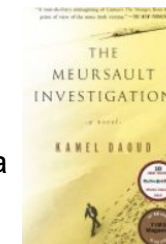
Salt Houses

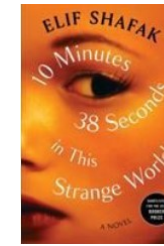

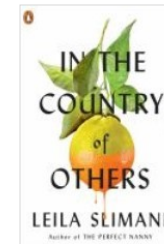

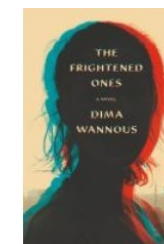
