Oregon Public Library Celebrates its Growth in 2010:

- 1. 2010 is the library's Centennial
- **2**. 6, 003 Village residents have library cards and 3,228 nonresidents also use the library resources
- 3. Library users checked out 323,320 items in 2009, an increase of 21.450 over 2008
- **4.** 1, 171 children and teens participated in the 2009 summer reading program
- **5.** 223 programs were scheduled for 2009 with the total attendance of 9,221 people
- **6**. The 13 public access computers were used 8,423 times in 2009
- **7.** People visited the library an estimated 175,000 times last year
- **8.** The library was open 3, 228 hours in 2009
- **9.** The library owns 61, 255 books and material in print
- **10.** The audio visual collection has expanded to include 9,197 items
